Pastor's Message

God's Eternal Love for All

"I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore I have continued my faithfulness to you (Jeremiah 31:3)."

February is the month of love. In just a few days, we will celebrate Valentine's Day. The word "Love" in the English language encompasses a wide range of meanings. But in the Bible, there are several words that are used to cover the rich and profound concepts of love.

Love is a relational concept. Love expresses itself differently in different relationships. What is appropriate in one type of relationship may not be so for other types. Also, love is never a one-way street, it is reciprocal. How we act and how we respond towards one another determines the strengths of our relationships.

As people of faith, our starting point to love is to appreciate God's love towards us. In the Old Testament, a key word describing God's love towards human beings is *hesed*. This word is used to describe the proper relationship between two parties in a covenant. As such, *hesed* is much more than lovey-dovey sentiments, but should properly be understood as God's faithfulness to what God has promised. Properly, it should be understood as loving-kindness, faithfulness, mercy, and steadfast love, etc.

Throughout the Bible, we are told that God initiates an everlasting relationship with humans, first to the people of Israel, and then to all of us through Christ. After God had brought the people of Israel from slavery in Egypt, God's words came to those who had been freed, "I will take you as my people, and I will be your God. You shall know that I am the Lord your God, who has freed you from the burdens of the Egyptians (Exodus 6:7)." This promise is not confined to the people of Israel, but to all of us whom God has freed through Christ. And yet, from the beginning to the end of the Bible, humans are described as covenant-breakers. We do what we want in disregard of God's love, as well as the needs, and dignities of others. We do not keep our end of the bargain, so to speak. The results have always been destructive and painful.

However, in God's *hesed*, God does not desert us. Instead, God always find ways to bring us back to God's own bosom through grace and forgiveness.

In turn, God also calls us to be God's own instrument of *hesed*, sharing God's love towards those whom the world ignores and despises. For in God's eyes, we are all God's jewel, and God's subject of everlasting faithfulness and love, or *hesed*.



SUNDAY SCHOOL



During the last several weeks, the children have been learning about prayer.

We discussed that prayer is a way for us to talk to God. We all know how talking to friends and family is important to us. So if talking to people is easy and we do it all the time, why is it so hard to spend time talking to God?

Sometimes we get busy. We don't see God so we forget. Maybe we don't know how. We might wonder whether God is listening. We might think our problems are too small. BUT: 1. God wants us to know Him. 2. God really does answer prayers. 3. God loves us through prayer. 4. We love God through prayer. So, they were encouraged to take the time to pray! And they learned they can pray for anything. They can pray for others, for themselves, for people who are sick, and ask God to help and guide them. They must always remember GOD LISTENS!

We have learned about The 23rd Psalm and will be learning about The Lord's Prayer and their meanings through Bible stories, worksheets, and crafts.

Our next curriculum will include stories about Jesus, his disciples, his ministry, and His great sacrifice for all of us.

How many days are in February? Can you name 10 holidays and events?

Enjoy these fun facts.

While February is the second month in our Gregorian calendar today, it was originally the very last month added to the Roman calendar (c. 713 BC)!

Originally, the calendar was 10 months because winter was considered a dormant, month-less period. January and February were added by the Roman king Numa Pompilius to better align the calendar with the lunar year. Eventually (c. 450 BC), February was moved to its place as the second month.

<u>February Calendar</u>

February 2 is Groundhog Day—the day we find out whether winter will last six more weeks or call it quits early.

February 9 is the Super Bowl in 2025.

February 12 is Abraham Lincoln's Birthday. The 16th president of the United States was born in a one-room, 16x18-foot log cabin with a dirt floor.

February 14 is always Valentine's Day. Heads up, lovebirds! Today, the holiday is celebrated with love, flowers, and chocolate.

February 15 is Susan B. Anthony's Birthday.

February 15 is also National Flag of Canada Day!

February 17 brings Presidents' Day, a federal holiday also known as Washington's Birthday that is celebrated on the third Monday in February. (George Washington's actual birthday is February 22!)

February is African-American History Month.

On average, February is the United States snowiest month, according to data from the National Weather Service.

Mashed Potato Casserole



CASSEROLE

1/2 cup (1 stick) salted butter, melted, plus more for the baking dish

1 (16-oz.) container sour cream

1 (1-oz.) envelope onion soup mix

4 lb. russet potatoes, peeled and cut into large chunks

1 cup heavy cream, warmed

1 lb. bacon, cooked and crumbled

8 oz. monterey jack cheese, shredded (about 2 c.)

1/2 cup lightly crushed crispy fried onions

1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt

Black pepper, to taste

TOPPING

1 cup lightly crushed crispy fried onions

1 cup lightly crushed kettle cooked potato chips with sea salt

1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese (about 1 oz.)

Chopped chives or green onions, for serving

Directions

- 1 For the casserole: Preheat the oven to 375°F. Generously butter a 13-by-9-inch baking dish.
- In a small bowl, stir together the sour cream and onion soup mix.

 Refrigerate while you prepare the potatoes so the flavors have time to meld.
- Place the potatoes into a large pot and cover them with cold water by 1 inch. Bring the water to a boil over high heat and cook until the potatoes are fork tender, 20 to 25 minutes.
- 4 Drain the potatoes well and return them to the same pot. Place the pot back on the same burner (heat turned off) and mash until there are no visible lumps.
- Add the prepared onion dip, melted butter, heavy cream, bacon, monterey jack cheese, fried onions, and salt, and stir to combine. Season to taste with pepper. Transfer the mashed potatoes to the prepared baking dish, spreading them evenly.
- 6 For the topping: In a small bowl, stir together the fried onions, potato chips, and parmesan. Sprinkle the mixture evenly over the top of the mashed potatoes. Bake until bubbling and browned on top, 15 to 20 minutes. Sprinkle with chives just before serving.
