Pastor's Message

Happy Easter!

"But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died (1 Corinthians 15:20)"

In a few more weeks, we will be celebrating Easter! Easter is about Life! There are multiple ways to appreciate the profound meaning of this life-changing event.

To begin with, it starts with Jesus' ministry and his death on the cross. The cross on which Jesus was executed was the worst kind of capital punishments reserved for violent criminals and or political insurrectionists suspected of treasons and/or rebellion against the Roman state. Yes, Jesus had some sharp words against the religious and civil leaders of the Jewish community and had disrupted the commercial activities at the temple (e.g., Mark 11:15-19). But by and large, his actions of healing and exorcism, and his teachings on the coming of God's kingdom of justice, love and forgiveness did not match what he was accused of – a criminal or a violent political insurrectionist who created havoc for his own purposes. He death reveals the power of evil not only in his time, by in our world and in all of us.

But God does not allow evil to have the final word. On the third day, God raised Jesus from the death, claiming victory not only over death itself, but over the forces of death and evil in our lives. To have faith is to have trust in God's power over darkness and death in our own lives through Christ.

In addition, Biblical writers used many ways to share the powerfulness of this event. For example, the verse quoted above, which is a part of this year's readings for Easter Sunday – 1 Corinthians 15:19-26. For Paul, Easter is not simply something that happened "on the third day" after Jesus' death. It is THE critical event with significances that reverberate through the ages. If you look at these verses, you may find how Paul uses several pairs of opposites to illustrate (rather than explain) the impacts of Easter: It is life over death...it is the first fruits over the dead branches in the winter...it is the new life in Christ over the death of in Adam...it is God's kingdom over the authority and principalities of Rome and any earthly powers,... Easter is about God's life in the world of darkness and death!

As for me, the powerfulness of Easter is sometime best expressed in images that we can relate to in our own lives. Please see the image on the right! It is God's life, God's abundant love and Life through the life, ministry, death and resurrection of Christ!



worship on Easter Sunday.







FAMILY RECIPES

Four Ingredient Pound Cake





Ingredients

- 1 2/3 Cup granulated sugar
- 5 large eggs room temperature
- 2 Cups all-purpose flour
- powdered sugar to sprinkle on top

Instructions

- Preheat oven to 350° F. Grease and flour a bundt pan.
- 2 Cream the butter in a stand mixer. Add sugar and cream together for 2 minutes on medium speed. Scrape the sides of the bowl halfway through. (#4 speed on Kitchen Aid mixer)
- Beat in eggs one at a time, beating each one for 3 minutes. (#4 speed on Kitchen Aid mixer)
- Add flour and gently mix in. (#2 speed on Kitchen Aid mixer)
- Pour the cake batter into a greased and floured bundt pan. Bake in preheated oven at 350° F for 45 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean.
- 6 Let cool in pan for 30 minutes and then carefully remove. Let cool and sprinkle with powdered sugar.


