### Pastor's Message

#### **Happy Easter!**

"Jesus said to [Thomas], "Have you believed because you have seen me?

Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe (John 20: 29)."

In the church liturgical calendar, which we follow, we are still in the Easter Season. A very fair question to ask is: How do I know that Jesus has been raised from the gruesome death on the cross? How do I believe without "seeing" Jesus' resurrected self?

This is an important and difficult question. But the story of Jesus' appearance to Thomas in John 20 might be helpful. In this story, the disciples and Thomas received the God-given grace of seeing Jesus in supernatural and dramatic manners (John 20:19-31). After seeing Jesus on the night of Easter, the 11 disciples told Thomas, who was not there on that night, "We have SEEN the Lord (John 20:25)!" And after Thomas had seen Jesus seven days later, he said, "My Lord and my God (John 20:28)!" And then Jesus said, "Blessed are those who have not SEEN and yet have come to believe (John 20: 29)."

The Greek word for "see" is *horaó*, which can mean both seeing *physically and literally*, as well as *perceiving* and *experiencing* in ways that are profound and often hard to explain. Thomas and other disciples *saw* Jesus physically, according to the Scripture. But that is not true for the vast majority of Christ followers, both ancient and present. Throughout the Old and New Testaments, there are stories of individuals encountering the Divine in physical, and dramatic ways, such as Moses' meeting with God, but these encounters are extremely rare. Some might have out-of-theworld *visions* that are mystical and dramatic, but these are moments initiated by God. Regardless, having mystical experience is not the prerequisite for faith.

In my experiences working among people of faith, I have come to appreciate the fact that people's faith in Jesus Christ does not usually come from any physical visions of the Living Lord. Instead, it is inspired by countless special encounters – some very mundane, and some more dramatic – through which Christ's presence can be *experienced*, or *perceived*. The examples include being moved by a hymn at the worship service, being touched a special Biblical verse, being comforted by a friend who come to help when we are in crisis.... The list goes on. In these moments, we probably do not SEE Jesus in any physical sense, but we SEE the Living Christ through people, events...etc. In this way, SEEING is perceiving and sensing in ways that we may not be able to fully explain.

Regardless, not being able to see the Living Lord physically is a not a deficit. Instead, being able to come to faith without this kind of seeing is a blessing!

We continue to support and many members weekly volunteer at Helping Hand's Food Pantry in Spring Grove.

Throughout the year, we have made several donations to McHenry Pads to provide much needed supplies for

the many homeless clients living at the facility.

At Christmas, through Adopt-A-Family, many donated winter hats, gloves, and scarfs along with a generous donation to enable Grant Township to provide gifts for many needy families in our community.

We welcomed many neighbors to our Pancake Breakfast as a way to highlight our church facility.

Throughout the year, our Care Team has sent cards and visited many of our homebound and ill members to provide fellowship and caring.

Our members are participating in the Trex Challenge, have collected more than 740 pounds of recycled plastic to help our environment, and hopefully receive a plastic bench as a gift for our property. Through generous donations, we were able to send funds to the East Coast hurricane victims and also collected \$1,105 that was donated to Christ the Shepherd Lutheran Church in Altadena, California whose members suffered great devastation caused by these fires and will serve the community by helping them to rebuild and heal.

All Saints continues to be blessed by Pastor Joe Chu with his leadership, compassion, and dedication as our Interim Pastor. He continues to "open our eyes" to the Bible through his sermons and Bible studies.

Pastor Sue Ellen Gram Grudt blesses this congregation with her amazing musical talent by enhancing each service with inspiring music and leads our choir to sing as "one voice". She diligently researches various worship resources to choose and format our bulletins for meaningful and thought-provoking worship and special services throughout the year. 





#### **FAMILY RECIPES**

#### **Creamy Pasta and Peas**

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 zucchini or summer squash, cut into thin rounds
- 1 small onion, diced
- 2 tablespoons olive oil, plus some for serving
- ½ pound short pasta, like shells or penne
- 1 pound bag frozen peas
- ½ cup grated Parmesan cheese
- Lemon juice to taste Fresh basil, if desired



#### **Instructions**

- 1. Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil on the stove.
- 2. While the water heats up, sauté zucchini or squash, onion, and olive oil over medium heat in a separate pan.
- 3. Cook pasta according to package directions, adding your frozen peas to the boiling water with 5 minutes remaining.
- 4. Remove 1 cup of starchy pasta water from the pot and set aside. Drain pasta and peas and return to the pot, along with onion, olive oil, and veggies.
- 5. While the mixture is hot, add Parmesan and stir. Slowly, begin to add the starchy water to the mixture. This is where the magic happens! The Parmesan and pasta water will emulsify to make a creamy, restaurant-style sauce no heavy cream involved.
- 6. Sprinkle with lemon juice, salt and pepper, and a light drizzle of olive oil to serve. Add basil, if desired.
